

Original 16 mm broadcast film of the 1950 documentary produced by 20th century fox; the 23 minutes documentary is narrated by Walter Cronkite and has rare footage from the life of Mahatma Gandhi.



An insight into a rare piece of history that documents the life and the message of the Mahatma, a fine art book – MKG – Mahatma Gandhi - Imaging Peace, Truth and Ahimsa by Birad Rajaram Yajnik runs a timeline covering major milestones which influenced his philosophy, political awakening and his concept of Ahimsa. A special edition of the book was released at the United Nations in New York to mark the International Day of Non Violence.

Mahatma Gandhi appeared on the cover of Time three times.





Louis Fischer (29 February 1896 - 15 January 1970) was an American journalist. Among his works were - The Life of Lenin, which won a 1965 National Book Award and a biography of Mahatma Gandhi entitled The Life of Mahatma Gandhi. This book was used as the basis for the Academy Award-winning film Gandhi.

Richard Samuel Attenborough, (born 29 August 1923) is an English actor, director, producer and entrepreneur. As a film director and producer, he won two Academy Awards for Gandhi in 1982. As an actor he is perhaps best known for his roles in Brighton Rock, The Great Escape, 10 Rillington Place, Miracle on 34th Street and Jurassic Park.
